The establishment of the Malay Heritage Museum was initiated through the visionary efforts of Professor Datuk Dr. Mohd Fauzi Haji Ramlan, former Vice-Chancellor of Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM), and Professor Dato' Dr. Abdul Mua'ti @ Zamri Ahmad, former Dean of the Faculty of Modern Languages and Communication, UPM. Their commitment to preserving and promoting Malay heritage laid the foundation for the museum's development. This vision was subsequently advanced by Associate Professor Dr. Muhammad Pauzi Abdul Latif and Dr. Rahimah Hamdan, former Directors/Coordinators of the Malay Heritage Museum, who spearheaded the acquisition and preservation of a diverse collection of cultural artifacts. These include rare manuscripts, traditional Malay attire, weaponry, and four distinguished traditional Malay houses representing Pahang, Negeri Sembilan, Perak, and Terengganu, which stand prominently within the Cultural Courtyard.

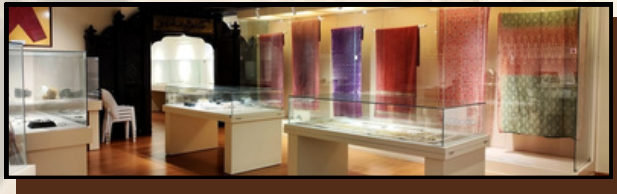

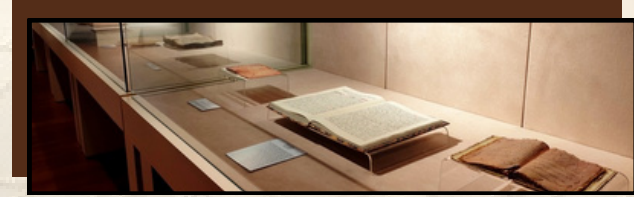

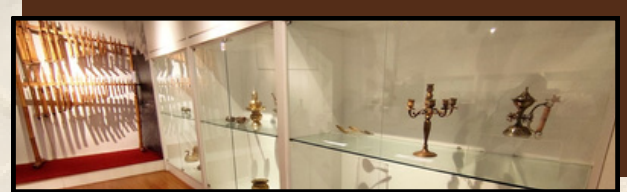
